Helping at home....

- Curriculum overviews- talking to your child about what we have covered
- End of term drop ins for your child to share progress with you
- Reading - Sharing books, talking about the pictures, being a good role model
- Reading book, please make comments in their reading diary. Even if just a signature to say they have read at home.
- Writing - encourage mark making, shopping lists etc
- Physical - fine motor - playdough activities, finger play rhymes, cutting
- Physical - Gross motor - Climbing at the park, running, riding a bike, balancing, throwing, catching, kicking
- Speech and Language – giving children time to talk, songs and nursery rhymes
- Understanding the world – nature walks, noticing changes in seasons etc..
- Technology – mouse skills, using technology for a purpose
- Counting - Play simple board games, laying the table, sing number rhymes and songs together. Shape, space and measures- using language to compare and describe time, size, shape
- Creative development – messy play (paints etc.) Developing imaginative skills.
- Supporting our school values; responsibility, Honesty, Co-operation, Care, Respect and Creativity.
